Former "No.6er", Frank Scholfield stated, "It's the camaraderie, the esprit de corps that keeps them coming back." And come back they did, from all over Canada, the United States and as far away as the U.K., Australia and New Zealand. As time caught up with many of the former personnel and graduates, fewer and fewer were able to make the pilgrimage back to Dunnville where it had all began. In the late '90's a group of driven individuals had the idea of establishing a museum to preserve the stories, artifacts and personal items of these truly legendary individuals. With countless hours of logistical work and physical labor, No.6 RCAF Dunnville Museum was established. 2024 marks the 25th Anniversary of the museum and members have planned a busy year of events. 

Total Solar Eclipse

On April 8, 2024, Southern Ontario will be treated to a unique celestial event. On the afternoon of the 8th, the moon will completely cover the sun, known as complete totality, causing a period of ~ 4 minutes of darkness. Making this event even more special is the fact that the grounds of No.6 RCAF Dunnville Museum lay in the direct path of the eclipse!



Members will be welcoming the Waterloo and Hamilton branches of The Royal Astronomical Society of Canada, to the museum grounds that day. The clubs chose the museum to set up their equipment to observe the eclipse because of the wide open areas that we have to offer. According to their website (<https://www.kw.rasc.ca/eclipse2024>), this is the first total eclipse visible in our area since 1925. The next time this will occur will not be until the year 2144! The branch members will have multiple viewing platforms set up and look forward to interacting with the public who choose to attend.

Museum members are working with Haldimand County to help promote the event as well as with local organizations. The Dunnville Fair Committee will be operating a food booth during the event to help raise funds for their upcoming season. The museum will be open on the day of the eclipse. As always, parking will be free and there will be a limited amount of eclipse glasses available for safe viewing of the event. From The Workshop

In January, Royal Canadian Legion Branch 142 Dunnville, reached out to the museum with a special request. In the 1990's, the Legion commissioned members of The South Haldimand Sky Hawks to build a replica of Harvard 2766 to proudly display in Branch 142. Using a scale flying model kit as a base and detailed photographs of the original aircraft located outside of the Dunnville Library, the members painstakingly spent 2 years building and modifying a balsa wood based replica. With working ailerons, landing/navigation lights and hatches, this dynamic piece of art has hung proudly in the branch for the last 30+ years. As time has elapsed, the years have taken a toll on Harvard 2766 and she began to show signs of wear and tear. Branch 142 contacted the museum to ask if we would be able to use the members expertise, to restore her to her former glory. Without hesitation, members transported the replica to our workshop at the museum where she is currently being doted on by our members. Patience, precision and dedication will ensure that before long, Harvard 2766 will once again be soaring over the patrons at Branch 142 Dunnville.

Stage Productions In The Hanger

The museum is not the only local organization celebrating a milestone this year. The Dunnville Community Theatre is marking their 50th Anniversary in 2024 by taking their show on the road. The group has 3 venues scheduled to perform their homegrown original play with the first stop being the hanger at No.6 RCAF Dunnville on June 14th and 15th.

In a recent conversation with writer and director Kathryn Stengel, she described the Theatre's newest project, "Next". "The production is a One Act Comedy Play/Event like you have never experienced before!
