“From Feathers to Wings”



When the idea of a Museum surfaced in the minds of interested individuals some 50 years after the No. 6 Service Flying Training School officially closed in 1944,

the property was being used as a turkey farm. In support of the project, entrepreneurs Russ Cameron, Vic Powell, and Dan Silverthorne bought the property, opened the Dunnville Airport, and provided the No. 6 RCAF Dunnville Museum with a future home.

At the May 11 monthly meeting, the picture below of some of the charter members of the Museum was taken. When asked about memories of pre-Museum days, Jack Murphy recalls that some of the founding members—Charlie Fox, Ray Deils, Jim Hopper, Gerry Jones, and John Scholfield—held meetings in the old No. 6 SFTS Fire Hall. He also remembers the work required to turn a turkey farm into a Museum: “When

renovations started, a fire truck was employed to hose down the ceiling, walls and floors to try to eradicate the turkey smells and old turkey carcasses stuck in the wall corners. The walls for the meeting room had to be rebuilt as...only the wall beams and roof remained. I was instrumental in the rebuilding and design work to give the No. 6 a home. Many, many hours of work was put in by many charter members in the first few years of 2000.”

Paul Segui joined the effort in the same way lots of other volunteers did—through talking with a friend who was already involved. He remembers well helping with the renovation, at one point wielding a jack hammer.

There were few women at the first meeting Sandy Murphy attended at the Fire Hall. Raffle fundraisers were discussed and Sandy, knowing all the requirements (she worked for the Town of Dunnville issuing lottery licenses), offered to do the paperwork. She recalls: “I had always vowed I would have nothing to do with Lottery Licences when I retired. Now, 20 years later I am still obtaining and looking after the Lotteries!”

Don Oatman saw finding the funds and the volunteers to get the project started as the greatest challenge in the formative years. His most rewarding moment was when the Museum finally opened. With that sentiment, he surely speaks for all the volunteers who worked so hard to give the Museum its “wings”.

Flight Instructor Hanna Returns to Base

Harvard Armour Hanna was a trainee at the No. 6 SFTS from August through October 1941. He returned as a flight instructor from September 1942 through August 1944, and then was transferred overseas to England. While at Dunnville in 1943, he was given "permission" to marry, which he did. His wife passed away in 2000.

Hanna turns 99 on July 1. He and his family are planning to attend our Annual Open House & Car Show on July 6. Hanna has kept records from his military service and is looking forward to visiting the Museum and sharing some of his experiences. This is a unique opportunity for us as we have little information about flight instructors at the No. 6 SFTS.



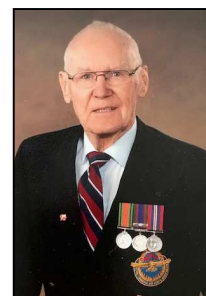

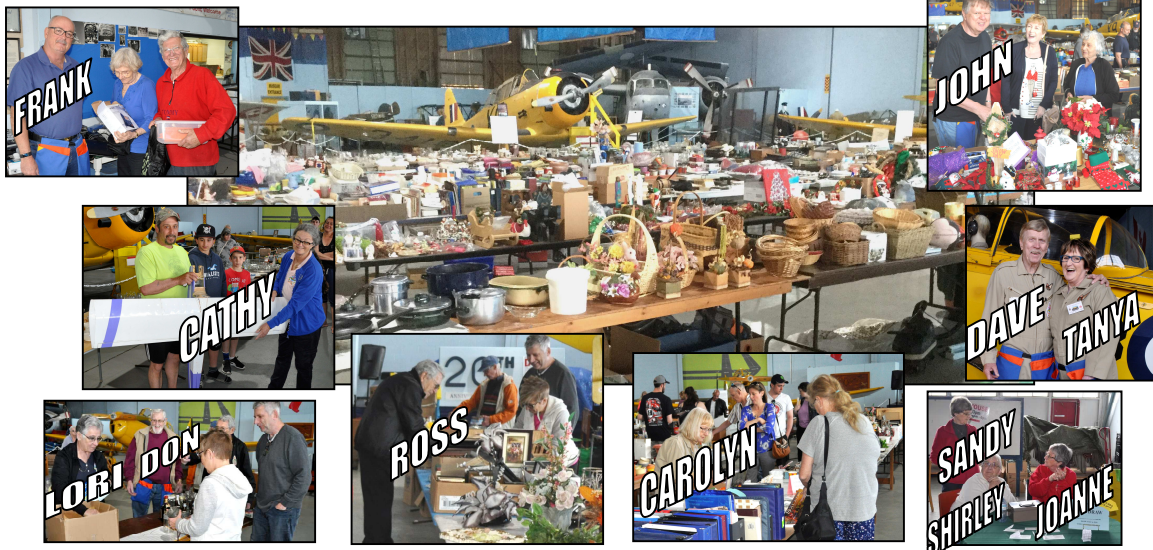

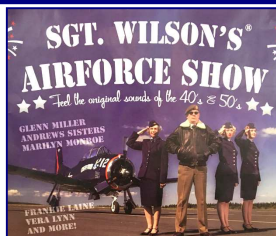
