MUSEUM COVID-19 UPDATE

As you know, early this year, the world was faced with a global health emergency—the coronavirus pandemic, COVID-19. Many actions have been taken on national, provincial, and local levels to contain the spread of the virus. The No. 6 RCAF Dunnville Museum has taken steps to protect our volunteers, members, and visitors.

Museum Closure

The Museum closed its doors to visitors at the end of March, in concert with Haldimand County and Norfolk County museums, schools, and libraries. A reopening date is not available at this time.

Museum Events

The following Museum events were/are cancelled:

- Season Opening and Yard Sale, May 16-18
- Open House and Car Show, July 4
- Chicken BBQ, July 4.

The Museum had planned to host "Sgt. Wilson's Air Force Show: LIBERATION!" in October. However, the show has cancelled its 2020 Canadian Tour. The Museum may host the show in 2021.

If COVID-19 restrictions related to gatherings permit and the Executive deems it safe, the following are tentatively planned:

- Open House and Car Show, August 1 or September 5
- Yard Sale, August 1-3 or September 5-7.
- Super Draw Elimination Draw Night, August 22.

Super Draw weekly and monthly draws are on hold until monthly meetings resume. Letters and order forms for the 2020-2021 Super Draw will be mailed to current ticket holders shortly.

Monthly Meetings

April 11 and May 9 general membership meetings were cancelled.

June 20 and July 11 meetings are cancelled.

If COVID-19 restrictions related to gatherings permit and the Executive deems it safe to meet by the August 8 meeting, members will be notified.
