Christmas in the Canteen

From the January 1943 issue of the "Skywriter". [These decorations were all made and hung by Women's Division members to give the canteen a festive atmosphere for those remaining at camp for Christmas.]

There were blue, gold, red and silver paper, folded to form rosettes, with a marshmallow for its centre; long white wool tassels, doughnuts with toothpicks stuck around them, and a cranberry at the end of each; strings of popcorn and pipe cleaners woven to form snowballs. A huge silver star topped the tree. The walls of the canteen were decorated with red pictures of Santa Claus, and huge red candles in blue candlesticks with yellow flames, all made from paper. Across one end was tacked up a red streamer paper in letters "Merry Christmas," and at the other end the same effect, forming the words "Happy New Year." In an aperture in the wall was a little scene of a snow covered village, blue sky and silver stars, with sleigh and reindeer and Santa Claus. all made from cotton wool and coloured stiff paper, and the reindeer of twisted pipe cleaners coloured brown....The windows of the canteen were draped at the top with white crinkly paper cut to form icicles, and paper doilies cut to form snow flakes on the panes of the window, while the sills were covered with cotton wool and sparkly crystals. In the archway was draped ropes of red, and over them strings of silver. Green and red ribbon made the centre from which big red and silver bells hung. The lamps were also covered with soft red paper and trimmed with white bows.

Did You Notice...

...a bright red addition at the entrance to the Museum? Volunteers John and Steve McKay refurbished and painted this fire plug headed for the scrap heap. It's not in working order, but was one of the original fire plugs at the No. 6 SFTS.


