A Bright Future for the Museum

A recent visitor to the No. 6 RCAF Dunnville Museum remarked: "I have been in many Air Force museums, and this is one of the best". As the Museum moves into its 16th year, members and volunteers can look forward to a long, bright future.

The Dunnville Airport closure to flight operations in June 2013 resulted in the loss of three, privately owned, airworthy, vintage aircraft. However, thanks to generous donations from Samsung and other benefactors, we purchased a Yale and a Cornell for static displays. In 2014, we obtained a scale model of a Mosquito bomber and a full-scale fiberglass fuselage of a Spitfire that was made for the classic film "Battle of Britain". Thanks to the support of Airport owner, Russ Cameron, several years ago, we own a Fleet Finch. Our 7/8-scale replica of a World War I Nieuport 17 provides a good reference for the major advance of aircraft technology represented by the Yale and Harvard.

We now also own the Grumman Tracker. While it is post-World War II, it is popular with visitors--they can sit in the cockpit and get a full appreciation for how cramped it is inside an operational Air Force aircraft. The search continues for a Harvard that can be put on static display to complement the Harvard on the pedestal in the Memorial Garden.

Thanks to a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation and hard work by the Tuesday Work Crew, the Memorial Harvard has been renovated. The grant also helped pay for replacing areas of flower beds with concrete painted to match the previous colour scheme, resulting in savings for the cost of the flowers and the back-breaking work to continuously weed the flower beds.

The Museum has signed a 10-year lease for our half of Hanger 1, with a provision for a 10-year

extension. A major advantage of this lease is that we pay no rent, only our share of property tax and insurance, which reduces our annual operational expense by nearly \$17,000. As a result, the Museum is on a firm financial footing. Revenue from our lottery ticket sales makes significant contributions to our revenue stream. Russ Cameron donated a 1,000-gallon water tank to free us from the vagaries of the airport well and water system which had been a problem handling large crowds during our Annual Open House and fundraising events.

The stream of Museum visitors continues unabated, in part because of campaigns to raise awareness with both local residents and tourists. Opening the Museum on Tuesday mornings has brought in a surprising number of visitors.

The Museum Executive continues to search for ways to enhance the Museum as a unique part of the area's heritage.

First of all I would like to extend a "Thank You" for all of the many and varied items donated to the No. 6 RCAF Museum in the past year. It is surprising after all of this time that articles appear on a regular basis.

Some of the items are donations to add to a family section that is already there by a member of the family. Another being an item found when the donor was moving, the grandmother of the donor had been a friend of the pilot trainee while he was at the base. Some involve entirely new donations like the one that gave us a body money pouch--an item that I had never seen before. Information on the various Squadrons are a great source of information as to what went on.

We had a rather large donation this fall from a family who had a member that graduated from this base--James Barbour. His mother saved everything. This is wonderful as not many of our donations come with so much information. Log book, pictures, letters written by the service man to his family at home, letters/telegrams of condolence upon his death.

who had also graduated in the same class. They trained together, they served together in the same squadron and they are together in death, buried seven graves away from each other in a cemetery in Scopwick Church Burial Grounds, Scopwick, Lincolnshire County, England, having both been KIA just 47 days apart. In this wonderful package of items was also information about John Gillespie Magee Jr. who wrote the poem High Flight, he is also buried in the same burial ground. Another member of the same graduating class --H.E. Gay--was the father of one of our members.

I should also say that the nephew of James Barbour who was the donor of the vast information donated --above--has become a member of our Museum.
